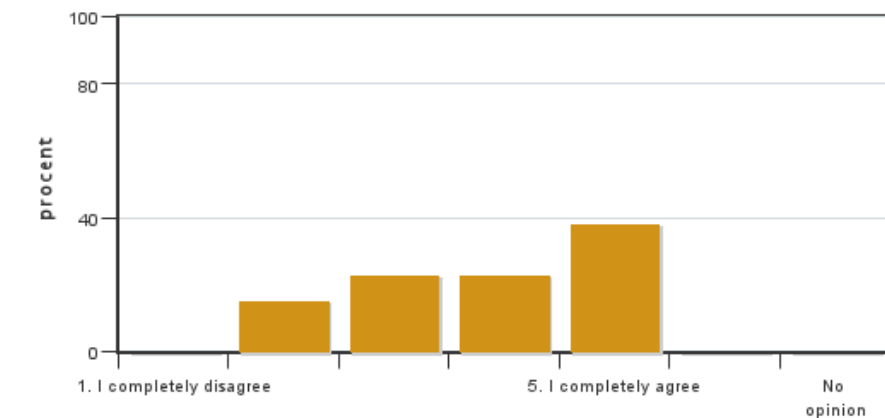

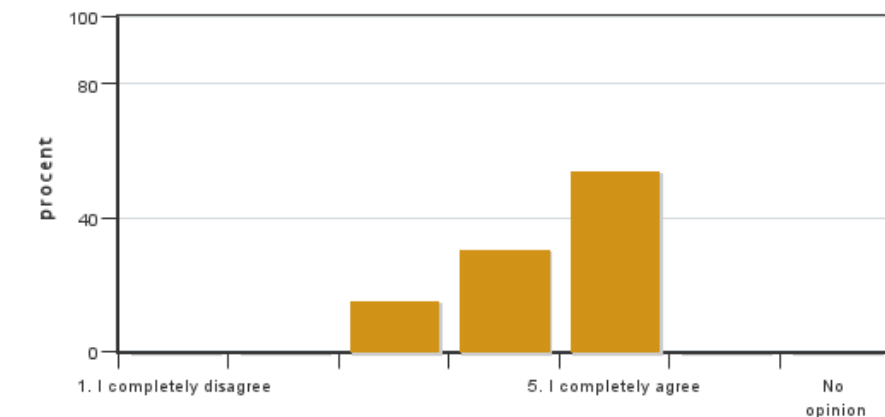

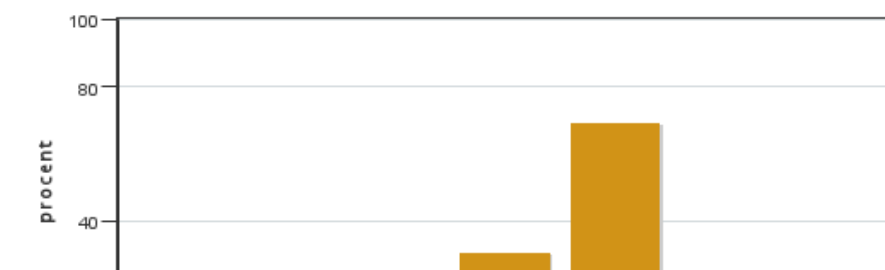

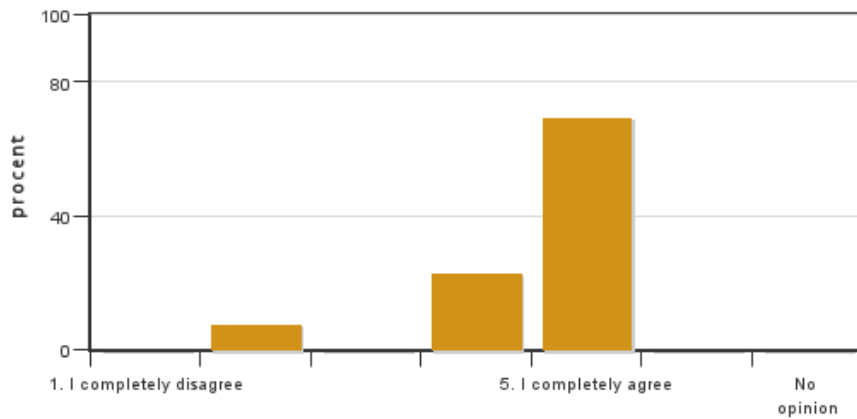

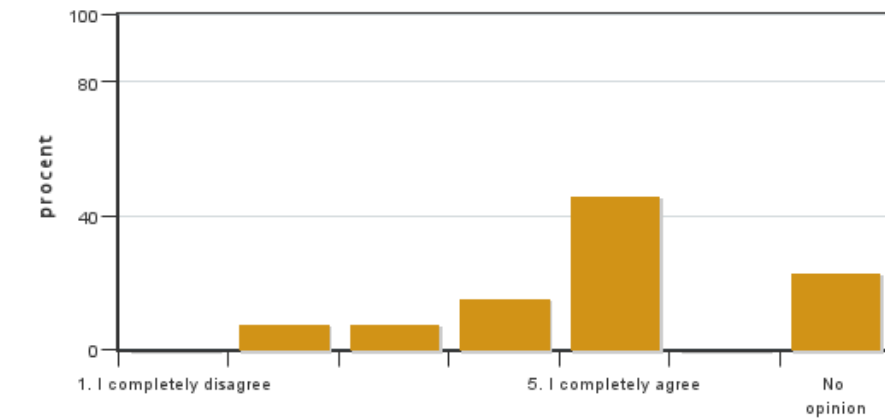

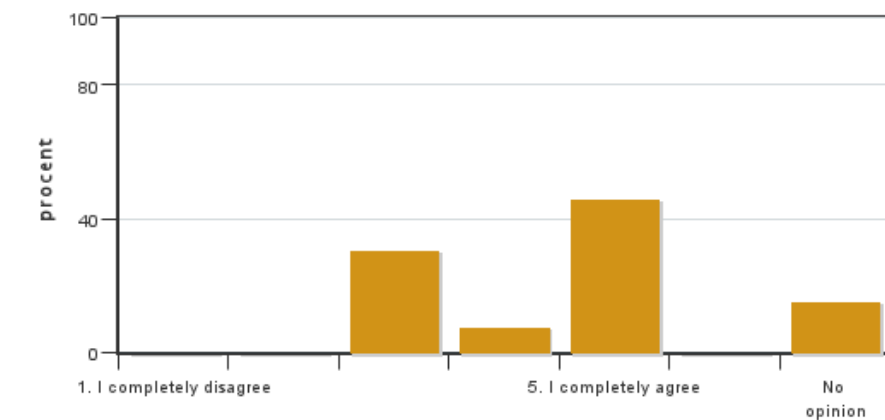

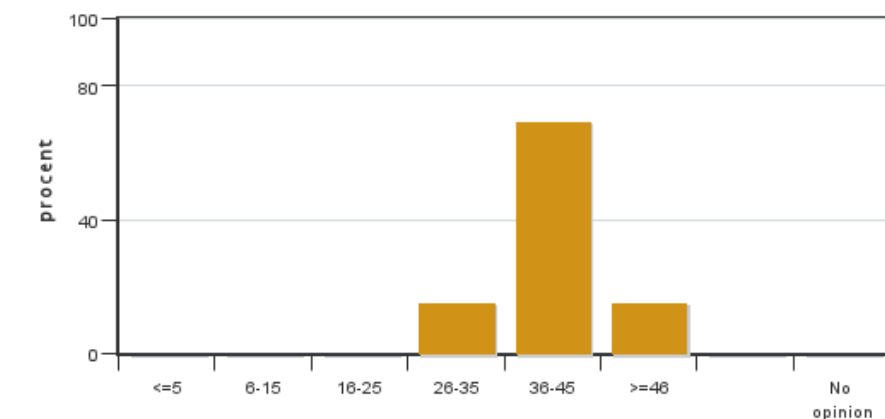

Student representatives comments

In general, students were happy with the course and found that the artistic approach gave them valuable perspectives on design that differ from the standard procedure in landscape architecture. Especially the introductory weeks seem to have had an impact on the students, who spoke of them as important for putting them in the right state of mind for the upcoming tasks. The slow walk and work connected to it was appreciated by a lot of students. So were the other workshops with watercolour, pop up-books, and plexiglass printing. If possible, some students would've liked even more workshops!

Some changes to the structure of the course in terms of communication and the arrangement of the exercises/seminars were asked for in the evaluations. It was mentioned that the seminars would've benefitted of having been held in smaller groups, also that it would've been good if the groups for the group assignments were deliberately organised. Some students expressed that they would've liked it if the final project had been introduced earlier (along with previous students' work), to feel better prepared for the final work. On a similar note, some students expressed that it was stressful when information about next day came the night before.

The final exhibition was much appreciated! The students described it as of great value and importance, something to keep for next years' course.
