Course leaders comments

I would first like to thank all students who took the time to complete this course evaluation. Indeed, your feedback matters and is an important tool that we use to improve the course design and teaching methods, and to ensure that the course content meets your needs.

Of the eleven students who took the course this year, five students completed the course evaluation, representing a response rate of 45%. Overall, the evaluation results indicate that students had good impression of the course, despite that there were two comments regarding the exam and the project. This is something that we will definitely take into consideration for next year's version of the course.

The majority of respondents agreed or completely agreed that the course content had clear links to the learning objectives of the course. Similarly, students agreed or completely agreed that their prior knowledge was sufficient and allowed them to benefit from the course. Generally, there was an agreement that the course information was easily accessible and that the course components supported their learning. In particular, solving exercises together with students during the online classes as well as the use of "Menti" were appreciate.

Only three students answered the question regarding the sustainable development aspects covered in the course and the responses suggest that there perhaps a need to strengthen links to sustainability. Finally yet importantly, the responses indicate that the majority of the students agreed that the course covered international perspectives.

The students had divided pinions regarding the extent to which the exam provided opportunity to demonstrate what they had learnt during the course (agree =3, neither nor =2). Some students pointed out that the exam was extensive and that it took too long time to answer. Other students indicated that having an exam and a project is too much for a 7.5hp course. Next year, we will talk more with the students about the grounds for examination and clarify, from the start of the course, what can be expected. We will also put more effort into designing the "project" task/assignment in way that takes into account the weight of the course (hp) and that does not represent a heavy load for the students.
