Course leaders comments

Teachers Course Evaluation Summary:

The course History Theory and Practice has this year, 2021, after the corona restrictions were eased somewhat at the end of August, partly implemented in the school premises, in Ateljén/The Studio, at SLU Ultuna. Most of the Practice part was done at SLU (except for the individual exercises that were done outdoors in different places chosen by the students), while the History and Theory parts were mostly done digitally. The course evaluation consistently received very good average points and the participation was high, with many individual comments, which we teachers see as very positive and which reflects the commitment we experienced was in the student group. We teachers also feel that the digital teaching has worked well and that the students have been satisfied. Please also read the course representative's summary which raises some questions such as that students have had problems understanding the course's administrative system Canvas, and that it has sometimes been difficult to understand advanced texts in English in Theory and some of the disadvantages of the classroom/Ateljén where we had problems with ventilation during the course. As for Canvas, SLU offers an introductory course for students, so it is strongly recommended to take part of that.

Important; The course requires that you can understand, read and write English at a relatively high level.

Student representatives comments

Students representative Course Evaluation Summary:

The course rated positive. The average score was 4,25/5, taking into consideration the generalization of questions presented in the SLU questionnaire. The negative scores were linked to the sustainable development aspect (which is not one of the key concentrations of the module (SLU question), as well as strong critiques of the Atelier, more specifically the ventilation of the space. Some students had difficulties managing their time, and understanding how Canvas works. It was also discussed the interaction between some students was limited, as well as difficulties reading the different texts, due to limited English vocabulary. Otherwise, the course rated overwhelmingly positive. Especially during the Covid -19 pandemic, the course kept the students engaged and driven.
