

Course leaders comments

Before this course iteration, the L&S teacher team had in-depth discussions regarding how the progression between the different course activities could be further strenghtened; and how these activities could be better contextualised and positioned with regards to the larger context that constitutes leadership and sustainability. The discussions resulted in development/revision of a number of course activities, most noteworthy the two group projects and one of the three case seminars. The teacher team is happy that these changes seem to have resonated with the students, e.g. indicated by overall course impression (4.6 in the course evaluation) and prevalence of sustainable development (4.7 in the course evaluation).

Furthermore, it is pleasing that the judgments regarding the social learning environment were high (4.9 in the course evaluation). We, the L&S teacher team, have paid plenty attention to this aspect of the course, both in the classroom and in the course planning. We are happy that our students found the learning environment inclusive, and will strive to repeat this the next time we give the course.

That being said, there is always room for improvement. One thing that has already been discussed (apart several more minor schedule changes and activity updates) is to develop and better contextualise the course activity where

we invite practitioners to our course. When done right, bringing in "reality" into eduction may constitute a powerful learning moment; and the current activity has the potential to do so to an even greater extent.

In conclusion, we want to direct a big thank you to our students for the constructive feedback in the course evaluation; and for the time and effort you put in throughout the course!
