

Course leaders comments

This year was the first year we since pre-covid that we had all lectures and excrusions IRL and not digital. We had 14 students that participated in the course. Overall a very good engaged group of students which made the entire course a lot of fun and supported an enriching learning environment.

We had good weather for our field excursions and all students were active and curious and seemed to enjoy these activities. The attendence at lectures was high and this is reflected in the exam results where the majority of the students did very well. This year we put less focus on the identification aspect of wild bees but still spent a day in the lab looking under the microscopes to identfy the bees and I think this was enjoyed by the students.

Student representatives comments

Summary of the course evaluation:

In general the course was experienced as very interesting with a good fun/information balance while some are of the opinion that it could have been more academically chalanging. lowest result per section is 4.5, there were mostly high grades for all the different sections.

There was no prior knowledge needed and some experienced the course as challanging but not too much. Student (s) with more prior knowledge though, experienced some parts were a bit repetative but understand that it is needed for the complete picture of the course. The exam was by some experienced as not challenging enough and mainly focussed on honney bees. The written report was however by some experienced as long (5 pages) and stressfull and some would have preffered to get points/grades for the written report. The exursioins and actually seeing the bees was very much appriciated as were the phylosophical discussions with the teachers (Nick is named specifically). While the free coffee was appreciated, the opinion of some was that the classroom was too cold. It was appriciated that there were more female than male teachers for a change.

In the last (distant learning section) were some comments given that I did not entirely understand, especcialy since there was no distance learning. It stated the following: 'Isn't teaching a two-way communication?... While this course have been open for communication, becuse the students are the one's that begin the communication.', 'a lack of instant communication' and 'questions, guidance communication and tips'. It did however also state that the positive relationships with the students was very good.

My own coments:

I realy enjoyed this course and in my opinion it was positive that the assignments were not graded and that the exam was not complately based on factual knowledge that you should learn by heart because it encouraged you to learn because you are interested instead of for a grade. I specifically enjoyed the excursions and the group discussions in the class since both realy helped to critically think about the subjects. Personally I think that the written assignment was a fine lenth since there was a lot of information to find but I can understand that for people who are not used to write in English it was pretty long.
