The library was outstanding as usual meaning the students' posters turned out really nice and pedagogically.

Next year we will plan for the statistics workshop to be compulsory and to have some more supervision on the statistics part.

It was overall a good course that was enjoyed by us students. The opinions about the course varied a bit among the students, with different backgrounds and previous knowledge, some found it more giving than others. Despite the differences, thoughts and ideas were respected and provided a wider perspective from different countries and cultures. For the students that had some previous knowledge the course did not provide much more depth in the subject, and the exam did not provide any challenge, other than to keep the answers short.

The discussions and PBL were appreciated and worked well most of the time, but the topics and following questions provided little variation. The workload of the course could have been better, it were a lot happening in the beginning, while the end got a bit empty.

All study visits were much appreciated and the visit to the slaughterhouse should be kept in the course when it is given again.

And as always, some prefer being on campus while some appreciate the hybrid teaching more, even though it can sometimes be difficult to have discussions over Zoom. It was good that more students could participate through hybrid lectures and discussions, considering that several got colds and the weather making it hard to come to campus for some.
