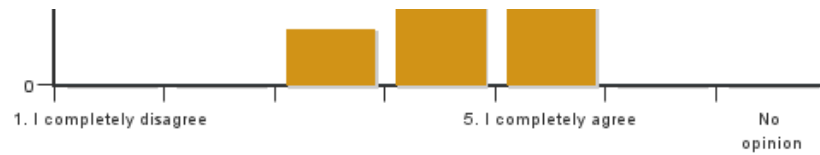

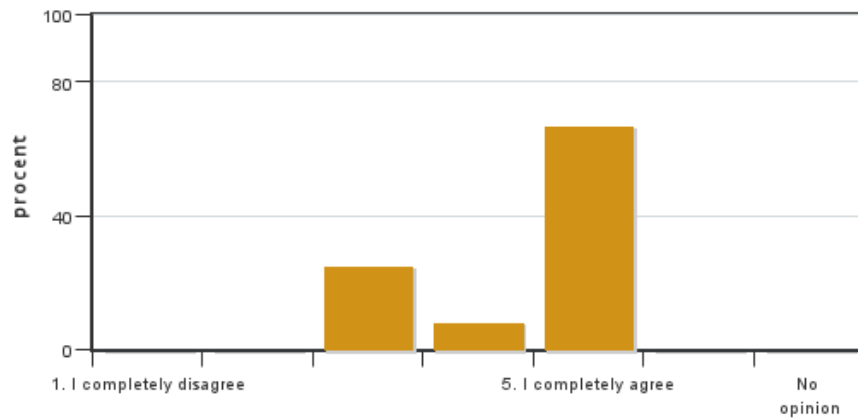

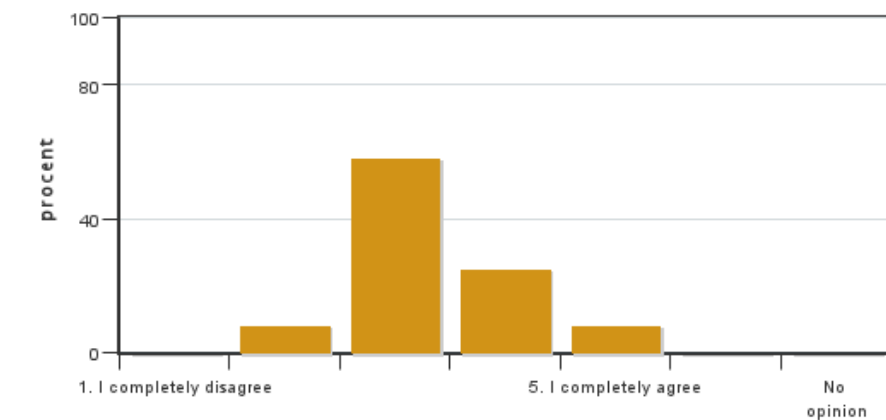

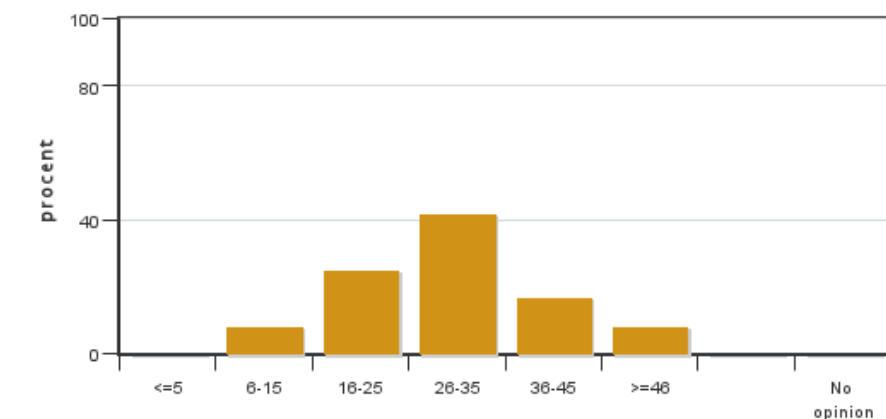

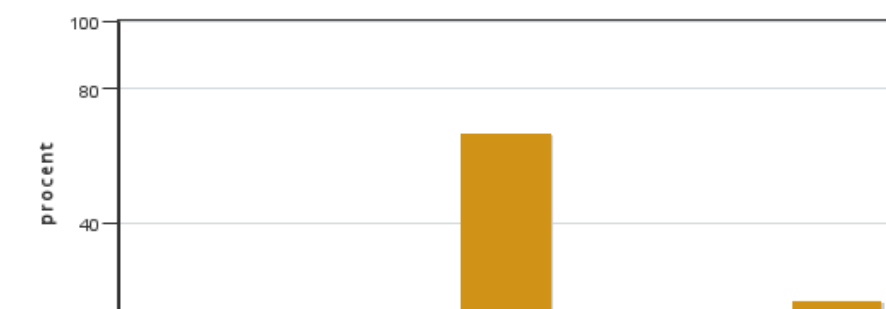

Course leaders comments

On April 12 2023, course coordinator Håkan Jönsson and student representative Kirsten Olsson met and discussed the evaluation. The following points were discussed:

The response rate was high, 75% of the registered students.

In general, the students found the course to be of high quality, with relevant teaching content, good premises, a reasonable workload and exam formats that allowed the students to demonstrate their learning outcomes.

On the weaker side was a lack of international perspectives, or rather a lack of perspectives outside Urban areas in the Global North. The students contributed with complementary perspectives, but it was suggested that the literature and lectures should be revised to include more perspectives.

There was also some confusion in the early part of the course. The diversity of the term and topic food planning made it difficult to get a clear understanding of the content of the course in the first weeks. Possibly also include a lecture about the fundamentals of strategy and planning.

Student representatives comments

The course was attended by students from the Food & Landscapes program and the Agroecology program. Students from both programs were very positive about the course and felt the course was an important class to take. Students agree that the group work and individual assignment supported the course content and contributed greatly to learning and engaging with the content. Many students commented in the course evaluation and in person that they enjoyed the weekly Friday seminar format and found the course readings to be beneficial. The majority of students would recommend this course to next year's students.

In the future, students would like to see more international perspective in the course literature and case studies, as well as a better balance between urban and rural perspectives. Also, it would be helpful to have a stronger introduction in the first week about the overall concept of "strategy" and how that applies to "food strategy" to ground the beginning of the course.
