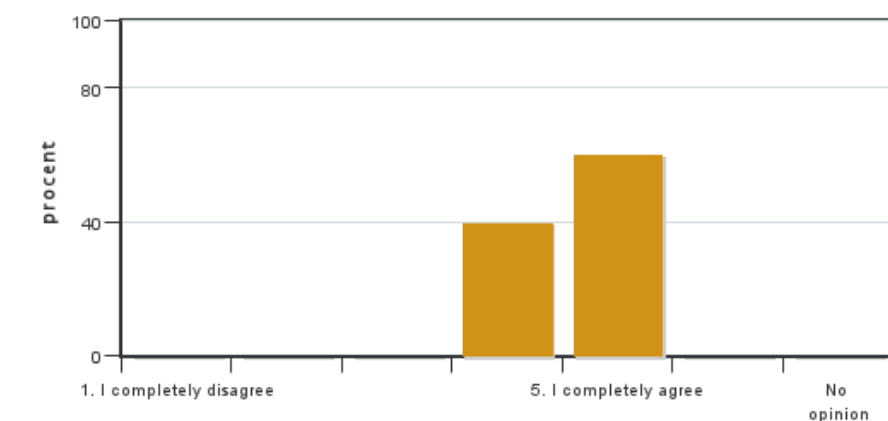

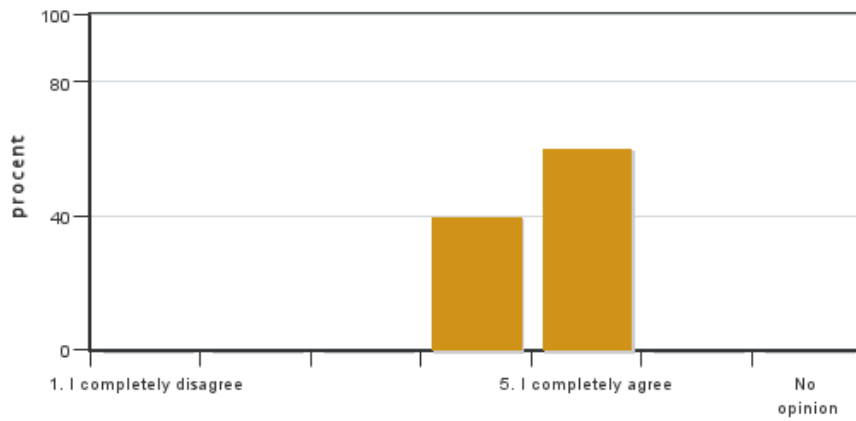

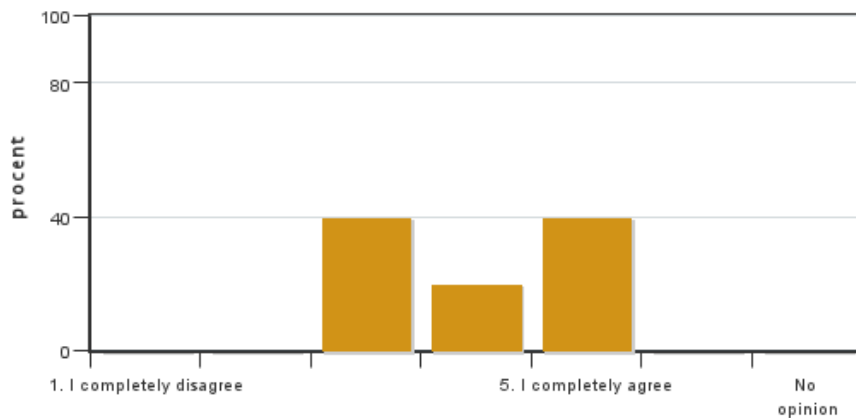

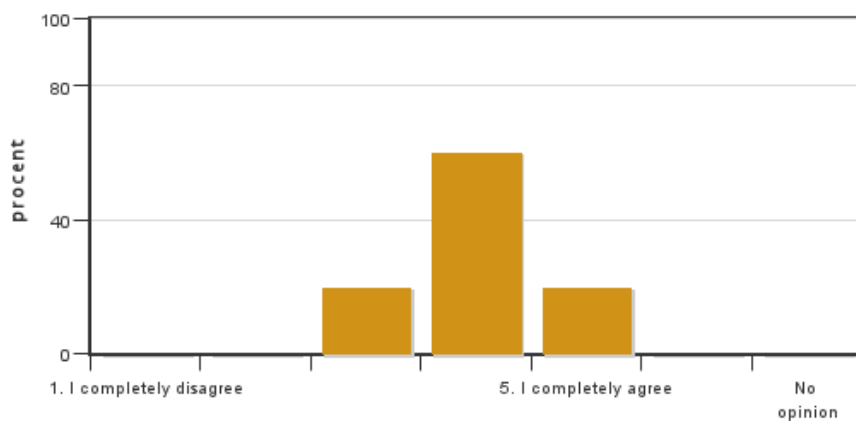

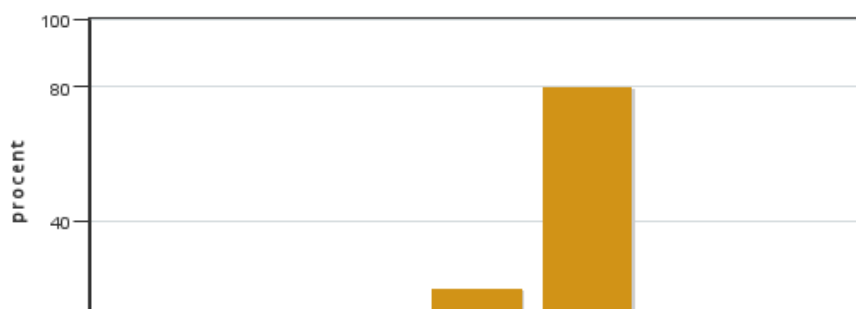

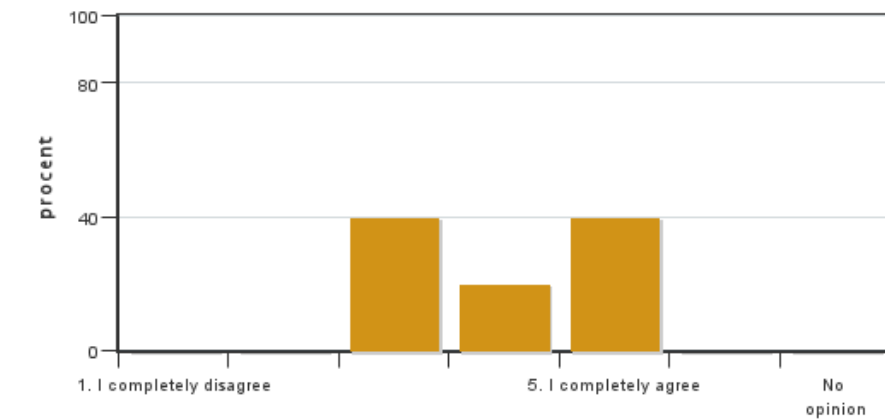

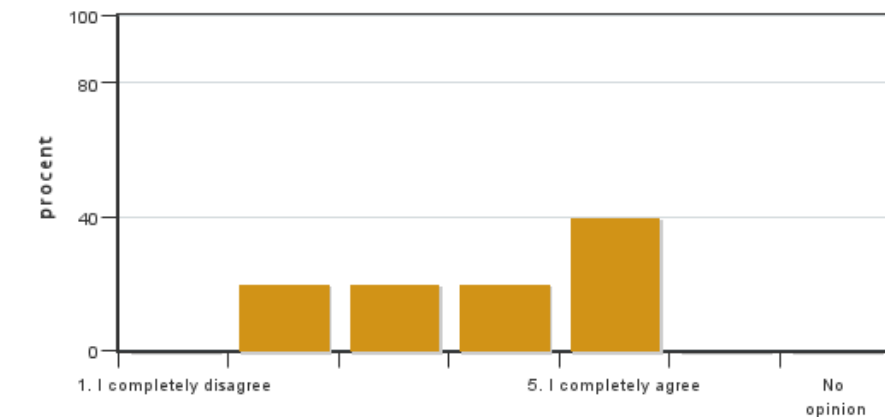

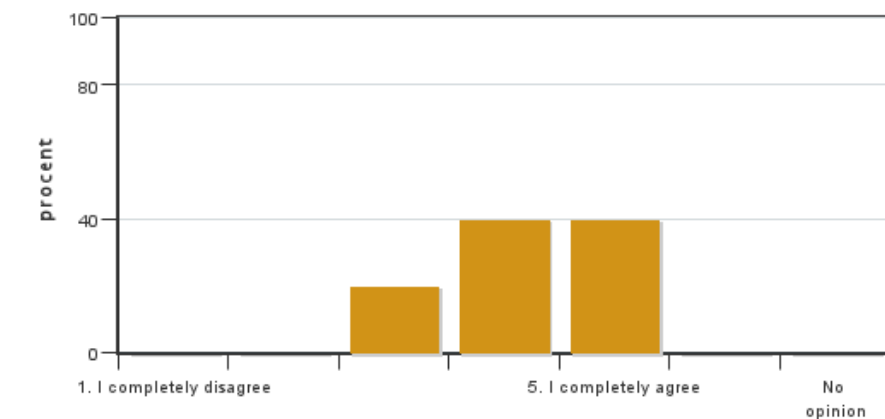

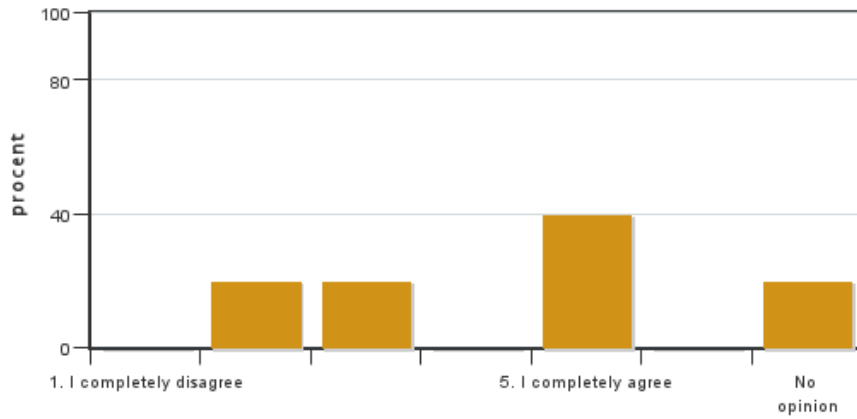

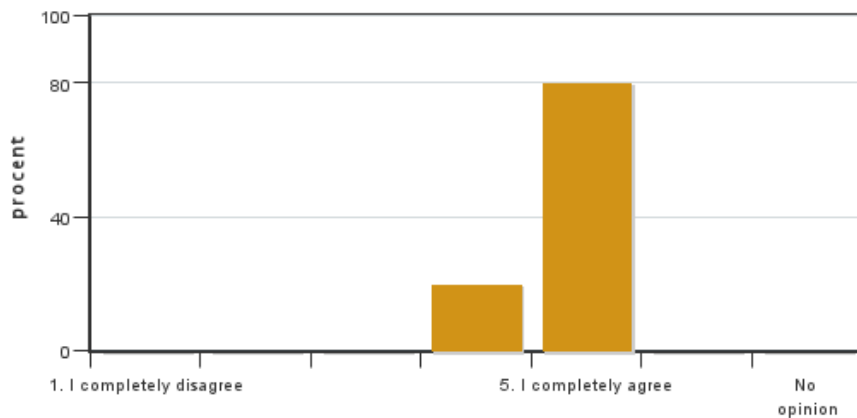

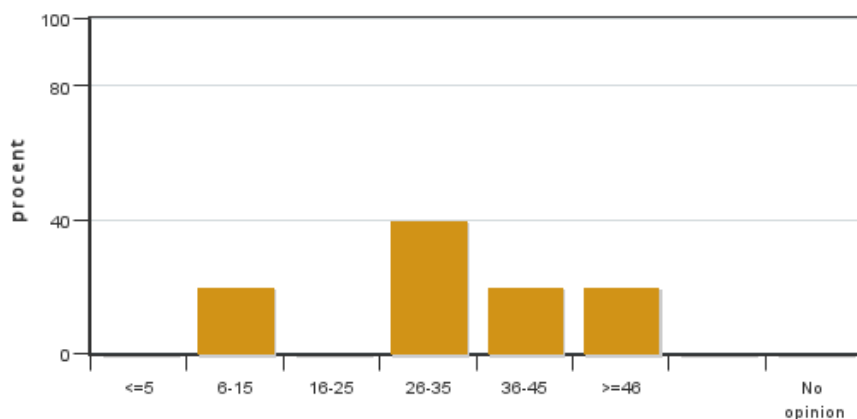

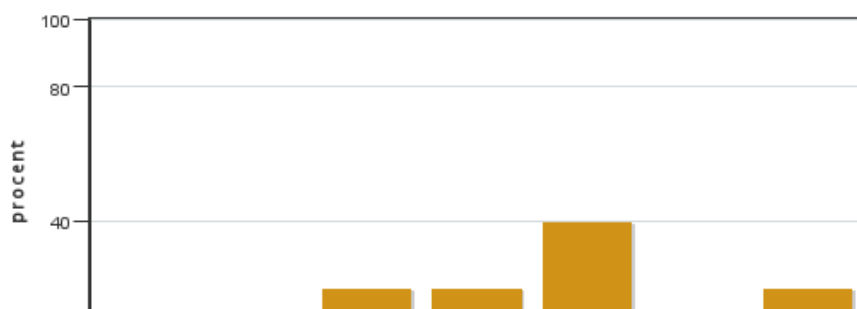

There was an interesting variety of lectures, given by many different lecturers from different countries with different backgrounds. The course offered international perspectives on the topic. Lectures were almost always in person, with zoom connection for students that could not be on campus. One of the skills learned during this course is how to work with R, including assistance for students that have not worked with R before. Despite extra assistance and extra tools to learn how to work with R, working with R was perceived as difficult. The course also included many interesting excursions in which the students gained practical skills. Changes in the schedule and time planning could have been communicated better. The exam covered many topics that were discussed in the course and was very broad in some parts while very detailed in others. The course ended with a presentation day, in which every student presented their individual work, followed by a discussion. This day was also perceived as an interesting and meaningful way to end the course.
