

## **Course leaders comments**

This is very disheartening for the lectureres who have given up their free time on a Wedneday evening to give thier lecture. Not all of the stundets looked at Canvas, where the notifications of zoom sessions were made.

There were four written assignments, all with clear deadlines. However, there were always some students who missed the deadlines, which meant that the grading could not be done until all the work was submitted. Since I have other work to do as well, this was never convenient but I did my best.

I am really surprised that one course participant thought that I would give all the lectures. This was never the intention. We want people from different backgrounds and with different expertise to provide thier viewpoints for discussion. Not all of the lecturers sent me reading to post on Camvas; not all of them wanted their lecture notes to be made available. I did my best with the material that I was given.
